## Facts, Figures & Illustrations ~ Egypt

### Land & Climate

Egypt covers 95,450 sq km, slightly more than three times the size of New Mexico, USA. It has a desert climate with hot, dry summers and moderate winters. The country is basically a vast desert plateau interrupted by the Nile valley and delta.

### Population

More than 76 million people live in Egypt. Life expectancy is around 70 years. Birth rate is on average 2.95 per woman. Literacy rate is 68% for men and only 47% for women.

### Languages

Arabic (official), English and French widely understood by educated classes.

## Pyramids

The first pyramid was built in 2700 B.C. The designer, Imhotep, did it so he could please King Djoser. It was based on a structure known as a "Mastaba", the Arabic word for "bench." King Djoser had wanted his body to be safe from the tomb robbers. After deep thought Imhotep came up with the step pyramid. Once designed, the step pyramid looked like one of those haystacks farmers make around Halloween that you can go on. Imhotep thought it would work, but after King Djoser was buried the robbers still found a way into his tomb.

The mastaba structure was constructed directly over the underground shaft holding the remains of the deceased. The above ground structure was rectangular in shape, had sloping sides, and was about four times as long as it was wide. This above ground structure had space for a small offering chapel equipped with a false door to which priests and family members brought food and other offerings for the soul of the deceased.

## The Book of the Dead

*The Book of the Dead* is the common name (named in 1842) for the ancient Egyptian funerary text known as "The Book of Coming" or "Going Forth by Day".

The book of the dead was a description of the ancient Egyptian concept of the afterlife and a collection of hymns, spells, and instructions to allow the deceased to pass through obstacles in the afterlife. The book of the dead was most commonly written on a papyrus scroll and placed in the coffin or burial chamber of the deceased.

## Mummies

A mummy is a corpse whose skin and dried flesh have been preserved by either intentional or incidental exposure to chemicals, extreme cold, or very low humidity. Mummies of humans and other animals have been found throughout the world, both as a result of natural preservation through unusual conditions, and as cultural artifacts to preserve the dead. Although mummification existed in other cultures, eternal life was the main focus of all ancient Egyptians, which meant preserving the body forever. Egyptian culture believed the body was home in the afterlife to a person's soul and spirit, without which it would be condemned to eternal wandering.



### Key Scriptures (From NKJV, unless otherwise noted)

**Hebrews 9:27** ~ *And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment.*

**Acts 4:12** ~ *Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved. (NIV)*

**Eph 2:8-10** ~ *For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.*

**2 Corinthians 6:2b** ~ *I tell you, now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation. (NIV)*

**John 11:25-26** ~ *Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die."*

**John 10:9a** ~ *I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved.*

**Isaiah 19:19-20** ~ *In that day there will be an altar to the LORD in the midst of the land of Egypt, and a pillar to the LORD at its border. And it will be for a sign and for a witness to the LORD of hosts in the land of Egypt.*



### Discussion Questions

1. Discuss what the Bible says about salvation. Discuss what you believe about eternal life and how it may differ from God's idea and plan.
2. The Bible declares in Proverbs 8:36 that "all that hate me (God) love death." Since God is the author of eternal life, why do men continually hate His instructions of life? Discuss the ways we disobey and ignore God's all encompassing picture of eternal life, and life in general.
3. To walk in victory we must distinguish between faith and fear. The enemy has managed to dilute much of our Christian walk by whispering subtle lies to us that we receive as coming from ourselves. Whose voice are you listening to? Are you responding to eternal life with fear or faith? Discuss the fears that most people have about death.
4. Discuss the deception of works-based faith and man's propensity to trust in his own works and goodness. (Hint: See Romans 6:23)
